Before the love of Jesus even the strong decision of St. Thomas too changed. And we see that Jesus tells to his disciples that because you have seen Me you have believed, blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed. It is about us Jesus many years ago. We are the blessed one whom he has chosen to spread his unconditional love....

JMJT "LET US ALSO GO, THAT WE MAY DIE WITH HIM" (Jn.11:16)

The above said reaction of St. Thomas is a response to the fear of the disciples and the response of Jesus to it. When Jesus wanted to go to Martha and Mary, whose brother Lazarus died, the disciples are cautioning Jesus about the threat of the Jews: "Rabbi, the Jews were just now trying to stone you, and are you going there again?" (Jn.11:8).Jesus is clear in vision and He is ready to go there. He wants His disciples also to be with Him. He says: "But let us go to him" (Jn.11:15).

What made Thomas to make such a strong statement: "Let us also go, that we may die with Him"? It is Love that Thomas had for Jesus that made him to go with Jesus even to death. It was not a silent Love.

It was a Passionate Love for Jesus. He was always in Love with Jesus. His reaction after the resurrection of Jesus is in pattern with his Passionate Love for Jesus. When he understood that he did not get the vision of Jesus after the resurrection, he is agitated and may be sorrowful. "I loved you so much, but why didn't You give me Your vision? I want You to come to me. I want to touch You. I want to experience You" This may be Thomas' inner argument with Jesus. And he declares to fellow disciples: "Unless I see the mark of the bails and I place my hand in his side, I will not believe." It may be seen as a statement of unbelief. But I like to see it as a statement of a passionate lover.

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Thomas in other words says, "I want to experience you, whom I love so passionately." Jesus answers him with His invitation to touch Him and experience Him. Thomas is crying out "My Lord and My God". Is it not a passionate proclamation of LOVE! Jesus answers the Love call of Thomas and Thomas in return surrendered himself to the Love of Jesus.

This passionate Love led Thomas to come to India and preach Jesus and become a martyr for Jesus. His desire was fulfilled in India: "Let us also go, that we may die with Him". In India he died not only WITH Him but also FOR Him.

Looking at us missionaries, Thomas is challenging and questioning us today. What kind of missionaries are you?Are you passionate for Jesus? Or are you happy to be merely namesake missionaries? Are you ready to die with and for Jesus?

Dear friends, this feast is inviting us to come out of our safe zones. We are called to respond to the signs of the times. It is a call to be passionately in love with Jesus. This passionate love will lead us to offer our lives with Jesus and for Jesus. It is the challenge that we face today. We are called to be Martyrs. Only a passionate lover can be a martyr.

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St. Therese our Patroness says:"I understood it was Love alone that made the Church's members act, that if Love ever became extinct, apostles would not preach the Gospel and martyrs would not shed their blood". According to Therese all heroic actions of the disciples and missionaries are prompted by their Love for Jesus. This is the love Thomas had for Jesus. This is the Love Therese had. And this is the Love that we need today, to be good missionaries. Let us be passionate missionaries.

May God bless each one of us with this LOVE for Jesus. Let this LOVE remove our fear to preach the Gospel and give us the courage to die with and for Jesus.

Months of May and June are decisive months for students, as the results of



After my Regency, I got an opportunity to go out for higher studies in Psychology. So, I was searching for a good course according to the direction given by my batchmates. They called me for an interview after two days and I passed successfully for the entrance exam. During those days I was residing in our CST ashram. One day I went for an evening walk around our Ashram and I saw a big church in the left side of the road. I went there and prayed. After the prayer I came outside and

saw a Perpetual Adoration Chapel in one corner. Suddenly I felt an affectionate touch from someone. I was not aware about the reality. I went inside the chapel.

There was no one in the chapel besides Jesus. I knelt before the Blessed Sacrament and started praying. Many thoughts came to my mind. Will I be successful in this course? What does my Superior expect from me? Such as these many thoughts disturbed me for a while. After a few seconds, positive thoughts started to flow from my hearts. I was happy. I could sense the voice of Jesus telling me-I will give the best for your future.I didn't get the meaning of this sentence. I wrote my intention to join in a course in a white paper and put before Jesus. I returned from the chapel as if I was saying a goodbye to Bangalore City!

After two weeks, I got a admission for a new course in Delhi. I was terrified as well as surprised. The course is not Psychology but media. Many things flashed across through my mind. I did not know that it was the real need of Jesus in this age. I reached Niscort Media College with lots of anxieties and fear for the studies about media. But, with the aid of my dear Chechi, St. Therese, I began my days here with a new vision and dream. It cheered my spirits in a big way. I could experience the calmness and serenity provided by the eco-friendly campus. I was fascinated by the beautiful campus and the unique 'pencil boundary' built between the adjacent school and the college. The green carpet lawn with sunflowers gave me a special experience.

The lovely tall palm trees standing with pride said a story different from other colleges. They seemed to say, one day you too will stand tall, strong and confident. My seniors welcomed me with smiles and warmth. The 'Chandan Tika' reminded me of my home. I felt welcomed to another family from my *Theresianfamily*.

NISCORT is a professional Media Training College for Journalism and Mass Communication Studies.

There are two courses in BA as well as PG. My course was Diploma in Pastoral Communication. There were two semesters of five subjects each. In the first semester they taught communication and media, editing - reporting, newspaper production, radio reporting and production, adobe software and editing, and documentary and film making. In the second semester the subjects were audio visual communication and production techniques, media event management, television journalism, graphic and multimedia applications, and pastoral planning. We had both oral and written examination for the subjects. I could gain many beautiful insights from this course not only in the media field but also in my personal growth.

Since the classes are about communication, there were many occasion to appear before the audience directly and indirectly through media. Faridkot A shram



* Summer camp for the catechism Children were held in Faridkot, Makhu and Mamdot and rest of the churches camp will be held at the end of June and beginning of July.






