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Fraternal Musings

Dear Fathers, brothers and sisters

First of all, I wish you all the blessings of Dhukharana. This year we celebrate the 1950th year of St. Thomas' heroic martyrdom. When we look back into the history of the Catholic Church, St. Thomas the apostle is the most misinterpreted disciple of Jesus Christ, because of his curiosity to see in person the risen Christ. He was criticized and misunderstood him for his disbelief and called him as doubting Thomas. Despite these, he is the father of our Faith and the founder of St. Thomas Christians in Kerala. His life can be summarized in three Words he was "Committed", "Curious" and "Convinced".

In John 11:5-16, we see the commitment of St. Thomas towards Jesus Christ. Jesus plans to return Judea hearing Lazarus is dead; but the disciples

discourage him saying that the Jews look forward to killing him. However, Thomas says "Let us also go, that we may die with him." The gospel does not speak what happened after that but we find in the next verse that Jesus and his disciples are at the tomb of Lazarus in Judea. Thomas was so committed to Jesus during his public ministry that he was even willing to die with Jesus. He empowered the others also to do so even before they were enlightened by the Holy Spirit. His martyrdom is an expression of his love for Jesus and testified he is the true disciple. The question arises am I able to become a living testimony before others?

A Curious Learner: An inquisitive student assists the teacher to explain the mysteries. In John 14, Jesus speaks to his disciples regarding his departure; "you know the way to place where I am

going.” The disciples were not able to understand him; were astonished and wondered at the mysterious way he spoke to them. Thomas asked Jesus “Lord we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?” In reply, Jesus unravelled the mystery that “I am the way, and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.” It is the experience of this mystery that enthused Thomas to board ship to Kerala, that all may know Jesus and through him, the Father. We have to unwrap the mysteries of the teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ. Revelling is believing and believing is testimony.

A Convinced Believer: St. Thomas was not with them when risen Lord appeared to the disciples. When he heard that Jesus appeared to them he was adamant and stubborn to believe until he witnessed it personally. Jesus appears again asking Thomas to be a believer. Thomas exclaims with supreme faith exultation “My Lord My God”. Let us be convinced of the real presence of Jesus in our lives too. Whenever we take Lord's most precious body and blood in the holy Eucharist we should also utter these words “My Lord My God”. St. Thomas was able to imbibe strength, faith and hope from Jesus and he spread it

wherever he went; and he was living testimony because he was committed, curious and convinced of his belief. As we celebrate the golden jubilee of our mission in Punjab- Rajasthan may St. Thomas help us to be committed to our mission and let us be convinced of our vocation and mission. Let him be our role model to spread the fragrance of Love, Care, Hope and Faith.

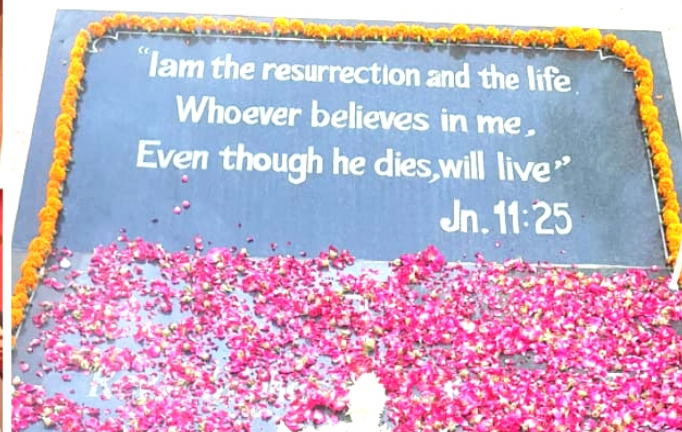
Welcome Dear Brothers

Desiderio Desideravi

RE-DISCOVERING THE HEART OF LITURGY

Introduction

Desiderio Desideravi is the Apostolic Letter by Pope Francis promulgated on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on 29 June 2022. With this latest document the Pope is calling the Church to a greater appreciation of and reflection upon the liturgical patrimony which we presently possess. The goal of this article, then, is to provide a framework to understand what the Pope is proposing for the Church, and so hopefully aid us in entering more deeply into our sacred rites. It is broadly speaking about liturgy. Liturgy is the way we give glory to God and the focal point of Christian Life.¹ Vatican Council II says, “liturgy daily builds up those who are within into a holy temple of the Lord, into a dwelling place for God in the Spirit, to the mature measure of the fullness of Christ.”² The council document encourage and exhort us rediscover the heart of liturgy and to have a liturgical formation for the better understanding of its place in Catholic life. Pope Francis affirms it saying “liturgy is “the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed, and at the same time the font from which all her power flows.”³ By this document, Pope Francis encourages to foster a liturgy-oriented life, not following the liturgy in routine but imbibing its spirit for better worship. In brief, the liturgy is a true encounter with God, not a performance.⁴

A brief summary of the document

There are eight sections so far of equal length; the first sections shorter in comparison to the proceeding.

1. The liturgy: the “today” of salvation history (nn. 2-9)
2. The liturgy: place of encounter with Christ (nn. 10-13)
3. The Church: sacrament of the Body of Christ (nn. 14-15)
4. The theological meaning of the liturgy (nn. 16-19)
5. Rediscover every day the beauty of the truth of the Christian celebration (nn. 20-23)

6. Wonder at the paschal mystery, an essential part of the liturgical action (nn.24-26)
7. The need for a serious and vital liturgical formation (nn.27-47)
8. *Ars celebrandi* (nos.48-60).

The Pope begins the document with a quote from Luke; “I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer”(22:15). This forms the foundation of his reflection on liturgy. The Pope continues to articulate, “all had been drawn there by the burning desire that Jesus had to eat that Passover with them.”⁵ Jesus desired to give his body and blood to humanity for its redemption. The Pope calls this as the supreme act of obedience to His Father.⁶ Therefore, it is an encounter⁷ and the sacraments are not things but encounters or events. Through sacraments, we are building our relationship with God, and Holy Spirit strengthens this relationship. Today, Lord Jesus “who lives forever with the signs of his Passion continues to pardon us, to heal us, to save us with the power of the sacraments.”⁸ The role of the Church is significant here: to fulfill the mission of Christ. Liturgy works as an “antidote for the poison of spiritual worldliness”⁹ in the Church. It removes our spiritual aridity and empowers our life with hope and love.

Therefore, there is a transformative spirit in sacraments. After explaining the sacrament's spiritual aspect, the Pope leads us to the second phase, limiting the scope of older liturgy or pre-Vatican Liturgy. The Pope says that we have to hold on to the Second Vatican documents for the celebration of the Eucharist.¹⁰ We are called continually to “rediscover the richness of the general principles exposed in the first numbers of *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, grasping the intimate bond between this first of the Council's constitutions and all the others.”¹¹ We should not go back to the pre-Vatican procedure as it is suspended.¹² Finally, the Pope speaks about the liturgical formation. All should go through the liturgical formation, including the ordained ministers.¹³ The liturgical formation is “not some thing that can be acquired once and for all.”¹⁴ It is ongoing and eternal. Everyday we must be refreshed and formed by liturgy. Seminarians, especially, should lead a liturgy-oriented life that will become a witness in their pastoral ministry, but it is often becoming a routine drama in many places. Sacraments should be celebrated with proper preparation, congregation, and in the Spirit of prayer. Good preparation makes the celebration more meaningful!

Evaluation and Reflection

First of all, as usual, it is a spiritual classic on Liturgy from Pope Francis. Pope Francis highlights the meaning and a life of a Catholic centered on liturgy. It is the “the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit.”¹⁵ Jesus is the epitomic example for an authentic liturgical life; His prayer, life, and deeds testify his encounter with God. He constantly prayed to the Father, taught and healed which he continues to do so through sacraments.

The Pope desires that seminarians particularly should possess a liturgical sense and discipline because he is not a secular man, his future will be centered on liturgical celebrations. He can't take, therefore, a holiday from it. It is always heard that “as a brother so a priest”. So, if we develop a liturgical discipline in seminary formation, it will have greater influence when we become ordained ministers in the church. The Pope recognizes “the action of the Spirit can only bring to the completion of our knowledge of the mystery of God.”¹⁶ The Mysteries of God is a question from the beginning, but it “is not a question of something grasped mentally but a relationship that touches all of life.”¹⁷ During the ology formation, liturgy becomes a topic to be studied. The Pope desires that we need to go beyond the scheduled discipline, connecting it to the context of our time and place.¹⁸

Spiritual worldliness is a not her sickness found among the priest and religious. It is the lamentation in the book of Revelation; “I know your deeds that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other!” (Rev.3:15). When we lose the fire in our hearts, we lose the happiness in the liturgy. When we lose happiness in liturgy, we live as if with out hot or cold. The Pope criticizes this mentality through many pastoral letters in the last ten years; “Shepherds should have the smell of the sheep.”¹⁹ “We need saints without veil or cassock. We need saints who wear jeans and sneakers. We need saints who go to the movies, listen to music, and hang out with friends...”²⁰ “I feel the secular mind set is working more among religious and priest. It is the need of the time, to have a change!

Liturgy is the “firsts our ceof divine communication.”²² Therefore, it should be taught to children. In the 19th and 20th centuries, parents were very strict with their children in learning faith articles. However, today, the learning of catechism has a rapid declension. Family prayer and spiritual talks are not common today.

The busy schedule of parents destroys the life of children mentally, spiritually, and emotionally. It will have a greater negative impact when they grow older. Many Christians left the faith due to the misconceptions they received from others. So, it becomes the responsibility of catechism teachers and parents to bring up a new generation who are able to integrate the mysteries of Christ.

There is importance for silence in the liturgy.²³ In the Eucharistic celebration, silence after the communion is meant for a close encounter with Jesus, who has come to our hearts. In many places, this silence is not used properly. In liturgical hours, we can also find the places where we need to reflect silently. This silence is meant for the Holy Spirit to boost our minds and hearts with divine wisdom. One observation that the Pope put forward is, blocking the work of the Holy Spirit., Religious and priests should not “block the activities of the Spirit.”²⁴ Spirit is working through each individual. Therefore, we should allow Spirit to work through us.

Finally, I noticed many quotes from Vatican II in this exhortation. The Pope wanted to highlight the Vatican II documents, which is the treasure of the Catholic Church. This exhortation is not intended to give a new shape to the liturgy but emphasizing what is all ready given to us. Pope Francis wants everyone to know the beauty of worship and do it with full heart and mind.

Conclusion

Jesus gave us his body and blood to save us from the clutches of sin because he loves us very much. The words from the cross, “I thirst,” become meaningful in this sense. The Passover that Jesus gives us is the nectar of immortality. It is a gratuitous gift. In order to participate in this Passover, we need a “wedding garment, which is none other than faith.”²⁵ Faith should lead us to altar, altar will lift us to heaven. The Pope desires that all should come to this encounter with Jesus in daily life. The disciples of Christ, the religious, should always be with Jesus in liturgical life. St. Therese, our patroness, also showed this path. She was always in the presence of the Lord. We also should bloom in the garden of calvary.

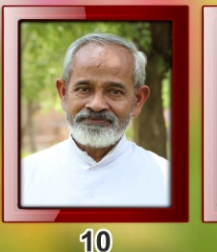
