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The Risen Christ

If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all men most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep (1Cor 15, 17-20).

In the above-quoted scriptural passage St. Paul states in unmistakable terms that Risen Christ is central to the Christian faith. In fact, Paul who played the most crucial role in the formation and growth of early Christian communities, began his journey as the Apostle of Christ after his experience of the Risen Lord on the road to Damascus, an event that radically changed his earlier convictions and transformed his being from "Saul" to "Paul". For Paul Christ is the only, but the definite assurance for the humanity of a life that extends this material world which is perishable by nature. Christ becomes meaningful for us because he has triumphed over death and still lives.

The Christianity would not have been born if Christ was not risen. For the apostles and the devout ladies who followed Jesus, Calvary had marked a tragic end of Jesus, whom they had regarded as the promised Messiah. The sadness of the disciples of Jesus walking to Emmaus speaks volumes of the desperation they had to live after the crucifixion of Jesus (Luke 24,17-21). The angel said to the women who came to honour the body of Jesus: ""Do not be afraid; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay" (Matt 28,5-6; Mk 16,6; Luke 24,5-7). "Why do you look for the living among the dead" (Luke 24,5) is a question that reverberated in the ears of those went to see the empty tomb. The nucleus of gospel proclamation is nothing other than the good news that Jesus is risen. "Jesus is risen and He is the promised Messiah" is the heart of the Kerygma that the apostles announced and testified to the early Christian communities. All the rest were subsequently added to narrate what had happened before and what has happened after the epochal event of the resurrection of the Lord, and to unveil the significance of Christ-event for the humanity.

The lessons on the Risen Lord are not simply concentrated on the Passion

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Narrative in the Gospels. They, in fact, are fundamental themes that Jesus wanted to teach His beloved disciples during their three years of formation. After Peter's solemn confession at Caesarea Philippi about Jesus' Messiahship, Jesus immediately began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo suffering and death and gloriously rise from the dead. Jesus foretells three times of His death and resurrection in all the Synoptic Gospels. This shows the utmost importance of Jesus' death and resurrection, the mystery of which was being unfolded to the disciples stage by stage.

The episode of the transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor that follows immediately after Jesus' first prediction of His death and resurrection explains further that the Messianic mystery cannot be understood in its entirety unless and until it is viewed through the prism of salvific events of passion, death, and resurrection of Lord Jesus Christ. While coming down from Mount Tabor Jesus ordered His disciples: "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead" (Matt 17,9). The vision on Mount Tabor has to be complemented by the vision on Mount Calvary for a fuller understanding of Christ events. Just as the disciples came down from Mount Tabor, so also they should come down from Mount Calvary to the valley where they would meet the Risen Christ. Once this vision is complete, the disciples are entitled to narrate the vision to the world.

The teachings on the Suffering and Glorious Christ were, perhaps, the hardest for the disciples to grasp. The Evangelists repeatedly say that the disciples did not understand what Jesus was telling them (Mk 9,32; Luke 9,45; John 12,16). However, once Jesus set His face to go to Jerusalem, He continually instructed them about His imminent crucifixion and resurrection. Jesus' final journey to Jerusalem is heavily

packed with instructions explaining the significance of the paschal events about to be taken place in the city of Jerusalem.

The Risen Christ continued to unravel the meaning of His death and resurrection to the disciples. Opening the eyes of the disciples to read the sacred Scripture in the light of the paschal events, Jesus said to Cleopas and to the other disciple: "Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory? Then beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures" (Luke 24, 26-27).

In fact, the Pentecost was the moment when the apostles really understood the meaning of Jesus' instructions, especially the teachings about the Son of Man, for the Holy Spirit revealed to them the fullest meaning of Christ's passion, death and resurrection on that felicitous day. Not surprisingly, their mission as apostles began that very day with St. Peter's solemn announcement that the crucified Jesus is raised from the dead (Acts 2,23-24).

Now that we are called to be the apostles of Christ in the modern-day world, we may have to raise a few fundamental questions to ourselves:"Do I really perceive the meaning of Christ's passion, death and resurrection? Did I meet the Risen Lord who Himself would interpret the meaning of the Scriptures to me? Am I filled with the Holy Spirit who alone can make me understand Jesus' words? Once again, Easter, the feast of the feasts, reminds us that encountering and knowing the Risen Christ is the requisite to be a follower of Christ. Let this season of

Easter bless us with apparitions of the Risen Lord and lead us to a blessed Pentecost.

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

"Go into the whole world and preach the Good News to all creation" Mk 16:15, was the final and only commandment that Our Lord has asked his disciples to do. And we are carrying the batten of faith wherever we are sent.

It was on 12th July 2021 that I first visited the villages in Sangaria with the help of Babu Abraham from Jalalabad. Sangaria is a Tehsil of Hanumangarh District in Rajasthan. The small town Sangaria is 30 kilometers away from Hanumangarh. It is situated on the borders of Punjab and Haryana. This municipality city is divided into 25 wards.

As the Lord said to his disciples, I was reminded of His Words, 'The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few', therefore pray to the Lord of the Harvest to send laborers to his harvest'. Each time when I visited the place, I could see the seeds of faith how it growing up. People are always happy to welcome us and they are ready to listen to the word of God. But the growth of faith and progress will take place only if we can be there with them...

Earlier there was a pastor who stayed over there and initiated the Christian faith. But on a later time, he left the place. Though many pastors visit the place very often, they don't have a shepherd with them. Sheep can be safe only when they are guided by a shepherd...and it's their wish and prayer that God would give them a dwelling place for their worship in an opportune time.

There are many villages in Sangaria itself and the people with faith are scattered in different villages. Only twice in a year (Christmas &Easter) they could come to Hanumangarh for the religious activities. Since our faithful are basically poor, they cannot afford to reach Hanumangarh every month. Also, mostly, they spend their time in the paddy field and reach home only in the evening.

St. Paul says, 'faith comes only through hearing'. This is exactly what Paul does in 2 Timothy 4:1-2:"I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke and exhort, with complete patience and teaching." When a pastor does this work well, the church flourishes. When he doesn't, the church flounders. any pastor may have greater strengths in shepherding or evangelizing, he must do both to the best of his ability in the power of the Holy Spirit. A healthy church makes Jesus known to Christians and non-Christians. So should a healthy biblical pastor.

In Luke 4:18, we read, ""The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Jesus was always aware about his mission for which He was sent. God wishes that all the souls must be saved.

A Christian missionary is an ambassador of Christ. All Christians, however, are called to be missionaries of the Gospel. A Christian missionary proclaims Jesus as Savior and Lord. God has called us to be with Him and become a witnessing for Him. Like Isaiah, a missionary gladly responds, "Here am I. Send me!" (Isaiah 6:8b). Let us be united with the Lord and become partakers in his Mission.

It's nice if we could venture into this area as we have been to different places before. There are a lot of Christians in this town from Punjabi background who needs a shepherd. Let's pray for the expansion of our mission territories. Thanks

We hope this letter finds you well and wish all the greetings of Easter!

We wanted to share with you some inspiring stories from our mission work in Africa.

Africa was a place of exploration from many decades and still it continues in different ways. We the CST fathers set our march into the life of people exploring the socio Pastoral needs and inking colors to their dreams.

Before we jot down the happenings of our Mission let us thank all our fathers who are expressing paternal care and brotherly concern to us. Your calls and friendly messages always unite us and remind us that we belong to one family though we are at the antipode.

We are 16 priests and 4 finally professed brothers who are doing their theological studies in Tanzania. After the joint visit of Very Rev Fr Superior General and Very Rev Provincial Superiors a new life has come to the Mission. New members, New Mission in Malawi which is the third country of CST presence in Africa. Soon we will open another station in Kenya in the diocese of Eldoret bordering to Uganda where we have an eye on to extend our Mission in near future.

In all our stations we are engaged in rendering the pastoral care especially preparing people for meaningful Paschal celebration. In most of our churches there are Lenten retreats and other special services for preparation of Easter. Catechism classes are going on especially for the Holy Communion students and confirmation students.

We have started our minor seminary and we have two Tanzanians brothers who have joined our mission seminary. They are going on well and under the formation of Fr. Philip Kallamplackal as their Rector. The theologians who are doing their theological studies in Tanzania also doing their level best in their academical activities.

Fr. Babyachan is working in village parish and he has 15 out stations. Most of the outstation has no permanent church structures, and had no funds for the construction. When he shared his dream of constructing a village church for the remotest substation, Very Rev Fr. Saju Augustin Koothodiputhenpuryil the Provincial Superior and his councilors agreed to support him for church construction. With local contribution and manual labor, he could save some amount which he could use for the construction one more substation as the jubilee memorial of Punjab Rajasthan Mission. Words are not enough to express our gratitude towards Khrist Jyoti Province for this wonderful gift for the poor faithful of Mtandiaka Parish.

These stories are just a glimpse into the wonderful work our priests are doing in Africa and we are so proud to support them. Please keep us in your thoughts and prayers.

On 17th January 2023, Carolian Theological Forum (CTF) under the banner of St. Charles Seminary hosted

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

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A TRIBUTE TO REV. SR. ANSLINE FCC (June 1st 1955 - February 27th 2023)

Rev. Sister Ansline FCC was born on 1st June 1955 in the Kottathara Parish of Manathawadi Diocese. When she recognised the inner call, she joined in the FCC Malabar Province on 6th October 1974. When FCC Malabar Province started its mission in Gujarat in 1979, Sr. Ansline was sent as one of the pioneer missionaries. When Mananthavady Province was formed in 1986, Sr. Ansline opted it. The state of Rajasthan was given to Manathavady Province to extend its missionary activities. Sr. Ansline was sent to Rajasthan in 1988 as its pioneer missionary and the Superior of Alphonsa Convent, Suratgarh the first house of FCC in the state of Rajasthan.

Sr. Ansline was a great missionary who loved the mission with utmost passion and made all the sacrifices gladly for the growth and development of Rajasthan mission. She was courageous enough to face the initial and ongoing challenges of life and the mission by embracing poverty and willingly discarding the comforts of life. She possessed an aura of contentment and remained happy in all situations, never heard of any crossword or argument or

complaint, but always remained available and approachable to everyone. She was a loving mother to all.

Sr. Ansline was entrusted with various responsibilities in the mission. She was the first Mission Superior (1997 to 2003) and the first Regional Superior (2006 to 2009) of Maria Rani Province Jodhpur. She also rendered her services as local Superior in various Convents.

Sr. Ansline was a diabetic patient since As she was 2006. suffering from various physical ailments, she was taken to MIMS Hospital, Calicut, Kerala for better treatments. On 30th November 2022 she was diagnosed with acute pancreatic cancer. She accepted her sufferings as the will of God. On 27^{th} February 2023 after receiving the Sacrament of the Sick she breathed her last to join her beloved Spouse in the Heavenly Abode. Sr. Ansline wrote in her personal diary, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give

thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1Thes 5: 16-18). She lived this Word of God in its fullness until her last breath.

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A TRIBUTE TO REV. FR. JOSEPH KOCHUPUTHENPURA (ST (04 April 1943 - 24 December 2022)

Rev. Fr. Joseph Kuchuputhenpura was born on April 4 1943 as the seventh child of Late Paily and Kathreena at Marika in the diocese of Kothamangalam. He joined Little Flower Congregation in June 1961. After completing his religious-priestly formation, he was ordained priest on December 17th 1970 by Late Cardinal Joseph Parekkattil.

Fr. Joseph served the congregation in various capacities, such as Procurator in Little Flower Major Seminary, Aluva, Assistant Vicar at St. Thomas Church. Malayattoor, Procurator in Social Welfare Technical School, Aluva, Procurator in Little Flower Novitiate House Chathamunda, Superior in Little Flower Ashram, Labhakkada, Finance Secretary in St. Joseph's Provincial House, and Superior at Sanjoe Bhavan, Mullakkanam. He also served the Gorakhpur – Punjab-Rajasthan mission for some time.

The history of Jhunjhunu begins with the pastoral works of Rev. Fr. Joseph Kochuputhenpura in Khetri Nagar. After the renewal of the contract in 1986 CST mission has extended its pastoral ministry also to Khetri Nagar. On 13th June 1997, Fr. Joseph reached Khetri Nagar. He served the station from 1997 to 2000. Fr. Joseph was also in-charge of the mission house at Mayur Vihar, New Delhi. Thereafter, Fr. Joseph returned to Kerala and served in the St. Joseph's Province. From March 2022 he was at Basil Bhavan. Mookkannur for On 24^{th} treatments. December 2022, he was called to eternal rest.

Fr. Joseph was one who loved his religious-priestly vocation and lived it honestly. He did all the duties entrusted to him with utmost sincerity and determination. He worked hard for the growth of the congregation with his heart and mind. May his virtues live with us.
