Subject: The Legion of Little Ones: A Study of Catholic Saints directly or indirectly inspired by the Little Way of St. Therese of Lisieux.

St. Therese of Lisieux popularly known as St Little Flower is undoubtedly one of the most influential Catholic Saints of modern times. She is one of those trailblazers of Christian Spirituality who set new paradigms for saintliness. There are several twentieth century and Millennial Catholic saints who directly or indirectly got inspired by her famous 'Little Way or Spiritual Childhood'. This research competition aims at first conducting a census of those known, unknown, canonized and yet to be canonized holy men and women and secondly, analyzing how their journey to holiness was directly or indirectly shaped by the life of the greatest saint of modern times.

One can approach the research in two ways. First in a general way, briefly schimming through the lives of as many saints as one can gather, whose lives were directly or indirectily inspired by the Saint. Second, in a more concrete way dwelling upon the life of a particular saint with special focus on how his/her spiritual journey is related to St. Therese. Criteria:

UNESCO stated that the celebration of this anniversary will contribute to giving greater visibility and justice to the women who have promoted through their actions, the values of peace. Her recognition by UNESCO is very significant because she is not only of interest to Christians but also beyond the frontiers of the Church. She touches the very essence of the human heart. This recognition "opens new prospects for the dissemination of her message of life, sanctity, peace and love to "the most remote islands" as St. Therese of Lisieux herself put it and to "the out skirts" according to the expression of Pope Francis."

As a lover of nature, she was aware of the depth of human person and encouraged humanity to take care of our Earth, "our common home", respecting the traditions and cultures of those who inhibit it. Her missionary desire motivated her to go out and meet the world to share with as many people as possible what makes her life and desire to continue to "do good on earth".

The Feast Celebration of St. Therese in the post golden jubilee scenario of the CST Mission in Punjab- Rajasthan invites us to intensify our devotions towards the Little Flower and to reinforce us in Promoting and nurturing the dialogue between faith and culture in the present milieu. Nonetheless, as members of the Little Flower Congregation, we have no better choice than our founder Very Rev. Fr. Basilius CST himself whose 47th death anniversary we commemorate on 4th October, to be that best example of assimilating the Little Way of St. Therese. 

St. Thomas' Feast



a fact that the people of Meghalaya and all the northeastern regions have different faces cut together. They over time have built up a low self-esteem about themselves as many outsiders come here in their native place to work and as a result, they are deprived of their jobs and opportunities. As a result, Khasi people tend to despise strangers. This we learned on September 7th, when three of us brothers went for an outing, and while we were returning to our campus, four or five Khasi teenagers who were on drugs halted us on our way, one of them landed a strong blow on my face and I was down. Somehow managed to get out of the situation and hurried back to the college. We informed the Rector and President of the occurrence, and they said it was usual in these areas and instructed us not to take that route in the evenings. Fathers on their part did what they could and raised the issue with the higher authorities. However, this experience taught me that as missionaries, we ought to go wherever our superiors send us. There is no guarantee that we will always be secure; we may be ridiculed, attacked, or even killed. But I constantly remind myself that I am not there for my own sake but for someone who needs my presence. I am here because of the God who called me. We might be able to live an adequate missionary life if we have this conviction and face whatever comes our way.

St. Thomas Catholic Church, Firozepur City, built as a memorial Church of the Silver Jubilee of the arrival of CST the Fathers in Punjab, is celebrating the Silver Jubilee of the Consecration of the present church on 29th October 2023. Blessed and Consecrated on 26th October 1998, by His Excellency Symphorian Keeprath of sweet memory, in the presence of Rt. Rev. Ignatius Menezes, Mar Dominic Kokkat CST and many dignitaries including late Rev. Fr. Felix Nellikunnath CST the then Superior General of the CST Congregation, late Rev. Fr. Paul Karumathy CST the then Provincial Superior of St. Joseph's Province, Rev. Fr. John Kudilil CST the Regional Superior and many distinguished personalities, St. Thomas' church has become a beacon of pastoral initiatives and fabulous growth in the pastoral and social arena.

St. Thomas Catholic Church, Ferozepur City was part of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Ferozepur Cantt until its establishment in 1976. After considering the fast growth of the Catholic community, the then Bishop of Jalandhar Rt Rev. Symphorian Keeprath bifurcated St. Joseph's Church to establish this parish.

From its inception, the parish had no church, and the Holy Mass was celebrated in the chapel of St. Joseph's Convent, Prem Nagar. The CMC community wholeheartedly supported and participated in the parish activities and made facilities available for the parish works. All the same, St. Mary's Church at Tenkanwala Basti in the city closer to the railway station, built in 1972 by Fr. Kurian Muttathupadam, was also used as a Mass center.

In the year 1984 CST Fathers took charge of the parish from the diocesan clergy as part of the new agreement signed between the diocese of Jalandhar and the Little Flower Congregation (CST Fathers).

The parish priest of the St. Joseph's church continued to be the priest in charge of the St. Thomas Church. The Assistant parish priest normally discharged the responsibilities of the parish and had independent charge. Growing number of the Catholics in the parish necessitated that a new parish church is established at the earliest and for this purpose half an acre of land was purchased in the present locality in the year 1989 when Fr. George Kulampilly was the Parish Priest and Fr. Jose Kattoor was the Assistant parish priest.

Fr. Jose Kattoor started staying in a rented house in the city to take care of the parish. After a year, Fr. Kattoor was transferred, and Fr. Felix Nellikunnath took charge as the Assistant. Financial constraints had forced postponing the

Felix, it gained steady momentum and the foundation stone for the new church was laid on 8th Dec.1995. The beautiful church was designed and engineered by Fr. Varghese Chittinappilly.

Fr. Cyriac Kochalumkal CST took charge of the parish after Fr. Felix had been elected Superior General of the Congregation. He looked after the construction with the support of the then administration and Fr. Varghese Chittinappilly. The new church was consecrated on 26th October 1998 as a memorial church of the Silver Jubilee of the arrival of the CST Fathers in Punjab. The visionaries who set the tune for this project were Fr. Felix Nellikunnath, Fr. George Kulampilly and Fr. Varghese

Chittinappilly. Mrs. Cambell, one of the chief benefactors of the mission then, was no less than these visionaries and she was the one who gave life to the project with her munificent contributions in terms of money and constant support.

Little Sisters of St. Therese (LST) established their first convent here on

16th June 2000 to collaborate with the CST Fathers in the pastoral and social ministries.

The parish was handed over to the Diocese of Jalandhar as per the new contract signed in the year 2020 but CST Fathers continue to serve in the station. The parish is blessed with many vocations to priesthood and religious life. Graciously remembered are the pioneer missionaries who toiled hard to look after this parish and CST Fathers contributed enormously for this mission. Our hearts go out to the overflowing contributions of Fr. Felix Nellikunnath, Fr. George Kulampilly and Mrs. Campbell who enjoy eternal bliss in heaven.

The concluding celebrations of the Silver Jubilee of the Consecration of the St. Thomas' Church will be held on Saturday, 28th October 2023. Rt. Rev. Agnelo Ruffino Gracias, the Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Jalandhar, will officiate the liturgical celebrations of the day. Fr. Silvinose Alilakuzhiyil, the present Parish Priest, who has been serving the parish for the last 6 years, is sweetly remembered for his people-oriented pastoral works and initiatives and for overseeing the silver jubilee celebrations.

Born on January 2, 1873, in Alençon, France, Thérèse Martin's spiritual journey has left an indelible mark on the world. She describes a transformative encounter at 14 during a pilgrimage to Rome, where she approached Pope Leo XIII, requesting permission to enter the Carmelite convent at a younger age than customary. Her request granted, she joined



the Carmel at Lisieux at 15, commencing an extraordinary journey toward sanctity.

St. Thérèse is celebrated for her "Little Way," a profound spiritual concept emphasizing simplicity, humility, and childlike trust in God. This teaching is particularly relevant to those discerning a priestly vocation, and it finds resonance in the Bible.

CONCLUSION






All the heights and glory what St Theresa of Lisieux had achieved was because of her deep and personal relationship with God specially with Jesus. Her God experience was so intimate and personal that she could not remain without thinking Him not more than three minutes. It means her body, mind and soul were fully engulfed and captured by the love and power of God. All these are resulted from her attachment to Jesus very specially to the Eucharistic Jesus. Although the participation and reception of the Holy Eucharist was not common and regular on those days, she had nurtured a deep affection towards the Holy Eucharist even from her early childhood. It might have been caused due to her pious family background, holy parents or her own sublime and divine character.

Her love towards the holy Eucharist had started even before she was four years of old. She narrates an incident in her autobiography showing her love and respect to it in the following way; "On Sunday, as I was too little to go to the services, Mamma stayed with me; I was very good, walking around on tiptoe during the Mass; but as soon as I saw the door open, there was an explosion of Joy, I would throw myself in front of my pretty little sister, adorned like a chapel, and say, Oh! Little Celine hurry, give me the blessed bread. Sometimes she did not have it because she arrived too late. What to do? I wasn't able to be without it as this was my mass. A way was soon found. You haven't any blessed bread, then make some. Celine got a chair, opened the cupboard, took the bread, cut off a slice and then very gravely recited a Hail Mary over it, and then she gave to me. After making a Sign of the Cross, I would eat it with great devotion, finding it tasted the same as the blessed bread.

In the autobiography, one of the best and most beautiful expression of her feelings is found in her description about the moments of the first Holy communion. She says "Ah! How sweet was that first kiss of Jesus! It was a kiss of love; I felt that I was loved, and I said; I love you and give myself to You forever. There were no demands made, no struggles no sacrifices; for a long time now Jesus and poor little Therese looked at and understood each other. That day, it was no longer simply a look, but it was a fusion; they were no longer two, Therese had vanished as a drop of water is lost in the immensity or the ocean. Jesus alone remained". Once Jesus entered in the life of Theresa her whole attitude and nature got changed. She says "after the reception of Jesus the beautiful dress Maria had brought me, all the gifts I had received did not satisfy my heart, only Jesus could satisfy and I longed for that moment again".

"It's not to remain in a golden ciborium that He comes to us each day from heaven; it's to find another heaven, infinitely dearer to Him than the First: the heaven of our soul, made to His image the living temple of the adorable Trinity." When we sit in front of Jesus, we are busy in pouring our worries and difficulties to Him and seek for full consolation and comfort from Jesus. But Therese' approach to the Eucharistic Jesus was quite different, she never went to Jesus seeking for any consolation but instead always sat in front of Him to give consolation and love to Him.



In fact, for Therese every holy communion and time in front of Jesus were of moments of intimate union with Jesus. She felt Jesus is giving Himself to her every time, and as the time passed this confidence and faith have turned as a reality. She departed the same peace and joy to her sisters which she received from the Eucharistic Lord.

Therefore, like the character, nature and the whole life St. Therese had been permeated by the influence of this relationship with Jesus, let's also imitate and experience the Eucharistic Lord more closely in our lives. May attending Holy Mass and praying before the Holy Eucharistic become the source and summit of our daily lives.

Jyoti Catechetical Fest 2023 Department of Evangelization

Evangelization means bringing the Good News of Jesus into every human situation and seeking to transform individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself. And if it is straight into the young blood of the Church, it becomes more effective and the Church becomes more powerful. Khrist Jyoti Province and its Evangelization Department is always innovative and ever active to bring about new means to proclaim the Good News. One of those such initiative is the Jyoti Catechetical Fest which began in the year 2021 focusing on the youth and children of our Parishes. The fest is not less than a Youth Festival where our Youth put up performances in Sports, Literary and Cultural events both group and individual, which bring them together under the banner of Parishes. These competitions last for minimum three months in which our youth and children are more attracted to Church and which further leads to firmness of faith in their life. More over our youth spend their evening hours in the Church or School campuses for the practices and preparations. And this year too we have had the Jyoti Catechetical Fest 2023 which is into its last lap, only remaining two items.

Inauguration

Inauguration of Jyoti Catechetical Fest 2023 took place on 6th August 2023 at Sacred Heart Church, Malout with the Basketball and Badminton competition for the Girls. The day began with the Holy Eucharist celebrated by Fr Vincent Chittinappilly CST, the Secretary, Department of Evangelization and homily preached by Fr. Jidhin Kurisinkal CST and few fathers concelebrated who came with the youth. The inauguration was held in LF Sports Academy Malout by Rev. Fr. Saju Kuthodiputhenpurayil CST, Provincial Superior who encouraged youth with his words in the presence of Fr. Shibu Menachery, the Ashram Superior and other fathers, Sisters, Teachers, youth and parishioners. 10 teams participated in Basketball competition in which the host team Malout became the champions and Bikaner first Runners up and Muktsar second runners up respectively.

Literary Events

The Message of Therese

Therese of Lisieux appears in the history of spirituality with a disconcerting originality. The fact that she carries her message in simple, at times even in childish language, takes away nothing of this originality. On the one hand, she says of her life, "The Almighty has done great things in the soul of His divine Mother's child and the greatest thing is to have shown her littleness, her impotence." On the other hand, this is the very person who knew to be an object of the special love of God, who was aware of never having lost her baptismal innocence, and who felt all the possible desires for perfection. All these realities are great graces. This perhaps accounts for its simplicity as well as for its depth and above all for its sublimity. Simplicity is the master quality that sets the tone in all her works, not because she was poor in intellectual gifts, but on account of the many complementary Virtues harmonized into unison on a higher level.

She is a saint of everyday life, without any show, but infinitely meritorious and filled with love, like the simple life of the Holy Family at Nazareth. Divine simplicity is so rich that it defies all our attempts at analysis, and the same is true of Therese's simplicity. Therese said to herself: "For simple souls, there must be no complicated ways." Her way will always be most ordinary and accessible to everyone. "There will be something in them for all, except those following extraordinary ways." She is a saint of everyday life, without any show, but infinitely meritorious and filled with love, like the simple life of the Holy Family at Nazareth. "I'm sure that her (The Blessed Virgin) real life was very simple." The most divine life under the most human exterior. All her greatness comes from her love. Great geniuses simplify the world, and Therese's genius goes directly for essentials: love, the blossoming in us of our baptismal grace, and perfect docility to the Holy Spirit "This consists of separating the accidental from the essential in an



object and then reducing the accident to zero and raising the essential to the infinite." The primacy of love sets all the rest free. The Little Way has a matchless hallmark of simplicity as its character.

Simplicity does not exclude depth, and on this point, Therese's genius resembles that of St. Thomas Aquinas. Spiritual childhood takes us back to the fundamental message of the Gospel: God's Fatherhood and our title of children of God, which makes us like the Son. Everything else falls into a harmonious perspective. Therese's littleness which leaves the soul nothing in itself to lean on, goes just as far in its stripping of the Ego, as St. John of the Cross with his mysticism of 'Nothing.' Her trust and abandonment go to the very limit of the theological virtue of hope. As to love, even among the greatest mystics it is not easy to find the ardor and the selflessness of the one who was pre-eminently the saint of pure love: "To love, to be loved, and to return to the earth to make love loved." One could say the same of all the aspects of Therese's mystical doctrine.

Hence her doctrine is closely connected with her life not only because it is perfectly incarnated in it, but also because she understood and formulated it progressively in the light of her lived experience. Looking at it from the distance of a hundred years, one gets the impression that God, who had entrusted her with the message of proclaiming the spiritual childhood, had so arranged her entire life as to make it an aid to formulate and live this doctrine. Therese's merit was to have cooperated with this divine plan in her regard. Thus we could have before our eyes this marvel of spiritual life.

The Gift of Fidelity and the Joy of Perseverance

The Gift of Fidelity and the Joy of Perseverance is a work that brings views regarding some of the recurring issues inherent in fidelity and perseverance in the state of consecrated life. To make us aware, the Congregation for Institute of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life has taken the initiative to articulate this volume. It proposes to provide certain guidelines for consecrated life based on the norms of the Canon Law. It highlights the current difficulties of members that they face in the institutes of consecrated as well as secular lives. The word 'Consecrated' means to be set apart, therefore, consecrated persons are set apart to love and live for God and His church. The being of consecrated life is to remain (Jn 15:9) in God's love.

Everything is getting changed day by day, our lives, culture, faith etc. since the beginning of the consecrated and religious life there exists a struggle for fidelity and lack of strength to perseverance. The era in which we are living is a period of great trials and tribulations where consecrated persons face difficulties in living a consecrated life. Consecrated life is a call to renew the heart and mind of the person. St. Paul says, so that they may discern God's will, what is good, pleasing, and perfect (Rm 12:2) and a call to remain 'forever' faithful to Him, the one who called (Jer 1:5-10). But finite beings after unsatisfied and discouraging moments in their lives run away from it. Pope Francis affirms; 'When the 'forever' is weak any reason is valid to leave the path taken.'

What is the reason why everyone abandons this consecrated life? The reason is simply the lack of perseverance to face the difficulties that occur in daily life. It is not normal to separate from the institute after long periods of formation and living this consecrated life for many years taking the oath to be a faithful servant until the last moments of life. Remember crisis can become an opportunity for transformation, purification, self-understanding etc. Another critical element that can be seen in the consecrated life is the difficulties that take place in our communities, i.e., problems in interpersonal relationships. People often live in isolation even in those communities where several members live. One of the reasons that can cause problems in the community is the ineffective use of the digital world. We should be able to see our fellow members as brothers and sisters in the bond of fraternity because we are members of one family (Jn 19:26-27) and have made a covenant with God as well as our brothers and sisters.

Now comes the question about the gift of fidelity and joy of perseverance. The world of consecrated men and women is getting renewed now and then, and remaining faithful is no longer taken for granted. If anyone desires to come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it (Mt 16: 24-25). 'Fidelity is the very being



of God's love', the love for the Church and his chosen people. The whole history of salvation is an indication of God's faithfulness to His chosen people. We know Israel was not a faithful generation, has gone astray and repeated to be unfaithful (Ps 78:8). But God was faithful to them even when they repeated their infidelity (Is 54:8).

There is no life without cross and suffering. We need to be courageous enough to embrace the pains and suffering because our role model and master is one who suffered until the last moments of His life being a faithful



child of Abba, said: My food is to do the will of the Father (Jn 4:34). The joy of perseverance made him faithful to God the Father. St. Paul denotes fidelity as one of the fruits of the Spirit (Gal 5:22). The faithful witness, Christ, teaches humanity to be faithful. We can never achieve this faithfulness through our efforts. Grace is given to us and invited to

respond to the Father through the Son who loved us and gave himself as a ransom for many. In consecrated life fidelity to the Father is the faithfulness to the Vocation, fidelity to Christ enables every consecrated person to be part of

the Risen One, and fidelity to the Holy Spirit enables one to be faithful to his or her identity.

Anyone who perseveres to the end will be saved (Mt 10:22b; 24:13: Mk 13:13). Perseverance is the ability to do something despite difficulties or delays. It is a vital quality of fidelity. In Perseverance, the genuine love of Christ is revealed. By testing our faith, we can measure the amount of our Perseverance (Jas 1:4). The perseverance of consecrated persons depends on following the rules and constitutions of their institutes. Do not be afraid to show the joy and happiness of having answered God's call. Nowadays many of the brothers and sisters with the loss of perseverance abandoned the consecrated life. All of us should seriously think about the reason to remain in this life and the reason for leaving this vocation. We are all responsible for the vocation of our brothers and sisters because we are 'united in Christ as a distinctive family'.

Consecrated persons should become men and women of discernment. They should become capable of reading reality in the light of the Spirit and need to choose, decide and act according to the will of God. The core of this life is to remain in the love of God even amidst pain, suffering, misunderstandings etc., which helps us to remain in the gift of perseverance. May God be our saviour, Jesus be our master, Holy Spirit be our strength and Mother Mary be our model, so that we may become faithful and persevering men and women of the Vocation received.

Amen.
